Against all odds, the sun was shining and we had a really positive response from people passing by, with a number of new members signing up for veg shares on the spot. We even managed to make a bit of extra money for the project by selling some leftover plants, which was an added bonus



Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> June saw in our first social event, in celebration of the Summer Solstice on 21<sup>st</sup> June. Again, the forecast was not good, but apart from a bit of rain for an hour or so, we were amazingly lucky with the weather, and by 7 o'clock it had cleared up into a beautiful evening with some lovely sun shining down on our small group around the bonfire.
